



Triad Health Project receives individual, foundation and corporate contributions; federal and state grants; and funding from local governments. THP is also a proud member agency of the United Way of Greater Greensboro and the United Way of Greater High Point. All programs and services at THP are offered to any eligible recipient.

WHO WE SERVE

In 2014-2015, Triad Health Project served 2,514 people through a combination of direct client services to people living with HIV/AIDS, HIV and other STI testing, and HIV prevention and education programs. The following statistics provide a demographic profile of our clients.

DIRECT CLIENT SERVICES: Served - 566 clients

GENDER: Male - 63% Female - 36% Transgender - 1%

RACE AND ETHNICITY: Caucasian - 11% African American - 73% Hispanic - 3% Other - 16%

AGE: 0-24 - 6% 25-49 - 51% 50+ - 43%

MODE OF TRANSMISSION: Heterosexual contact - 50%

Heterosexual contact & IV drug use - 3% IV drug use - 6%

MSM - 33% MSM & heterosexual contact - 1%

MSM & IV drug use - 2% Other or Unknown - 4% Perinatal - 1%

- 83% of THP clients were living at or below the Federal Poverty Level

- 99% of THP clients reported a history of some complicating factor, such as homelessness, substance abuse, or mental illness

TESTING: Tested 713 people

NUMBER OF FULL SCREENS (Testing for HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea, and Chlamydia): 675 people

GENDER: Male - 55% Female - 45% Transgender - <1%

RACE AND ETHNICITY: Caucasian - 12%

African American - 26% Hispanic - 2%

Other or unreported - 3%

AGE: 24 or younger - 51% 25-49 - 40% 50+ - 9%

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING: Approximately 1,151 people

FREE CONDOMS DISTRIBUTED: 19,600 condoms
